Dear Parents and Staff

#### Pertussis (whooping cough)

There has been a confirmed case of pertussis (whooping cough) in a child attending Bronte Public School.

#### What is pertussis and what are the symptoms?

Pertussis is a highly contagious bacterial infection, which can be a very serious illness in infants. It is spread by droplets produced by coughing and sneezing. The first symptom is usually a runny nose followed by a cough which becomes worse and may last for months. Pertussis should be suspected when anyone has:

- coughing occurring in spasms, often followed by vomiting, or
- a whoop, a sudden noisy in-drawing of breath at the end of coughing, or
- a cough that lasts for two weeks or longer.

Adults and children may have a persistent cough only, whilst the first sign of the illness in small babies may be short spells of not breathing.

#### People most at risk of severe disease are:

- Infants < 6 months of age
- Pregnant women in the last month of pregnancy (because they could infect their newborn)

If your child or any member of your family develops symptoms, please contact your family doctor and take this letter with you, as soon as possible.

#### What should people with symptoms of pertussis do?

Your doctor can arrange for testing (a throat swab is the best test) and treatment if needed. If you have no symptoms, testing will not be useful, and I strongly advise against it.

A person with pertussis is infectious and can spread it to others for 3 weeks after coughing begins, but if treated with the correct antibiotic in the correct dosage a person is no longer infectious once they have had 5 days of treatment (although the full course may be 7 days).

#### How is pertussis prevented?

To help prevent the infection spreading, children diagnosed with pertussis should not attend school or child care (or any other group activity) until they are no longer infectious.

Vaccination is the most important way of reducing pertussis in our community; however, this protection fades with time, so that **vaccinated people can still get the disease**. Booster doses are now given at 18 months, 4 years of age, in high school and during each pregnancy.

It is important to double check that your child is fully up to date with their immunisations against pertussis. If in doubt, please ask your doctor to check.
