Supporting Your Child's Literacy and Numeracy Skills

NSW Student Learning Library



The <u>NSW Student Learning Library</u>, developed by the NSW Department of Education, is a free public collection of interactive resources and learning experiences, for parents, carers, and students to use at home. The library currently contains K-2 English and Mathematics learning resources aligned to the NSW K-6 syllabus. Further K – 10 resources will be released over the next few years. These learning resources are also available in non-digital format allowing you to download and print them. Some of the resources in this library include:

Literacy

- Phonological awareness activities,
- Phonics pronunciation, games and activities,
- Decodable readers,
- Activities to explore and expand vocabulary,
- Writing prompts, structures, activities, and conventions.

Numeracy

- Counting strategies and activities,
- Number bonds and place value games and activities,
- Pattern activities (repeating and growing patterns),
- Fraction activities,
- Exploring properties of 2D and 3D shapes,
- Grouping and sharing activities,
- Activities involving informal and formal units of measurement.

In addition to the NSW Student Learning Library, the NSW Department of Education has developed an <u>Everyday Maths Hub</u>. The resources within this hub have been designed to help parents and carers engage positively with their children about mathematics. This hub includes creative video explainers of maths topics for students, interactive activities, inspiring reading lists, and fun games, for students, parents, and carers to engage with. All activities have been designed to help your child develop confidence and nurture skills in maths.

In addition to visiting your local library, additional reading resources you can access include:

- <u>Wheelers Online Library</u> Decodable readers, leveled readers, and junior fiction (Your child can sign in using their school username and password).
- NSW DOE Decodable texts (phonics focus)
- SPELD decodable readers
- NSW DOE Must Read Books for Your Child
- NSW Board of Studies Suggested Texts

Next week you, your child, and your child's teacher will work collaboratively to set your child's literacy and numeracy learning goals. The resources discussed above may assist you and your child with working towards these goals at home. If you require further resources to support your child's learning needs, please contact your child's teacher or myself.

Pick Up Zone Instructions



School pick up zone

From 3pm Monday to Friday - Please do not have your car in carline idling before 3pm.

Parents and carers who choose to use the 'Pickup Zone' will be asked to place the surname of the child on an A4 piece of paper either on the dashboard or in the passenger sun visor.

Pickup zone Instructions - To make sure our students are safe we have developed a school pickup zone with a specific set of steps:

- Enter Hewlett Street via Dickson Street.
- The first car stops at the top of the pickup zone and subsequent cars pull in behind. Ensure the Real Lane exit and turning circle are kept clear.
- Children are supervised and not allowed to exit the school gates until the person who has come to collect them has stopped safely within the pickup zone.
- Only the students of the first three cars waiting in the pickup zone will be called and loaded.
- Cars queuing behind will move up to the top of the pickup zone when the first three cars have driven off.

Drivers must exit the pickup zone slowly and carefully, please exit by turning right into Read Lane. Drivers are not to leave their car for any reason.

If your child/ren is/are not in the waiting area once the zone has started in the afternoon, you will be asked to move on and come back around.

Teacher volunteers assist with the operation of the 'pick up zone', please be respectful and attentive to their instructions.



BEHAVIOURAL FAMILY INTERVENTION PROGRAM

A group program for parents/carers raising 5-12-year-old children with difficult to manage behaviours

This six-week group program is a Behavioural Family Intervention Program for parents/carers that aims to reduce difficult behaviours by focusing on:

- · Improving parent-child relationships through the use of play and other positive activities
- · Effectiveness of praise & rewards when reinforcing appropriate behaviour
- · Effectiveness of instructions when setting necessary limits on behaviour
- Use of preventative strategies that limit the causes of undesired behaviours
- Consistency and type of responses to less desired behaviours

Who: For parents/carers of 5-12-year-old children (Children DO NOT attend the program)

What: 6 x 1.5-hour weekly in-person group sessions. Attendance at all 6 sessions is required

When: Thursdays 9:30am - 11:00am from 7th March 2024 to 11th April 2024
