





Supporting Your Child's Literacy and Numeracy Skills

NSW Student Learning Library





The NSW Student Learning Library, developed by the NSW Department of Education, is a free public collection of interactive resources and learning experiences, for parents, carers, and students to use at home. The library currently contains K-2 English and Mathematics learning resources aligned to the NSW K-6 syllabus. Further K – 10 resources will be released over the next few years. These learning resources are also available in non-digital format allowing you to download and print them. Some of the resources in this library include:

Literacy

- Phonological awareness activities,
- Phonics pronunciation, games and activities,
- Decodable readers,
- Activities to explore and expand vocabulary,
- Writing prompts, structures, activities, and conventions.

Numeracy

- · Counting strategies and activities,
- Number bonds and place value games and activities,
- Pattern activities (repeating and growing patterns),
- Fraction activities,
- Exploring properties of 2D and 3D shapes,
- Grouping and sharing activities,
- Activities involving informal and formal units of measurement.

In addition to the NSW Student Learning Library, the NSW Department of Education has developed an Everyday Maths Hub. The resources within this hub have been designed to help parents and carers engage positively with their children about mathematics. This hub includes creative video explainers of maths topics for students, interactive activities, inspiring reading lists, and fun games, for students, parents, and carers to engage with. All activities have been designed to help your child develop confidence and nurture skills in maths.

In addition to visiting your local library, additional reading resources you can access include:

- Wheelers Online Library Decodable readers, leveled readers, and junior fiction (Your child can sign in using their school username and password).
- NSW DOE Decodable texts (phonics focus)
- SPELD decodable readers
- NSW DOE Must Read Books for Your Child
- NSW Board of Studies Suggested Texts

Next week you, your child, and your child's teacher will work collaboratively to set your child's literacy and numeracy learning goals. The resources discussed above may assist you and your child with working towards these goals at home. If you require further resources to support your child's learning needs, please contact your child's teacher or myself.




Creating a School Bytes Absence


All absences are now to be completed and submitted through the School Bytes app. This includes whole day or partial day absences. Please follow the steps below if your child is.
