



named: "where does your food come from?" As well as covering classes in literacy, numeracy, art, science and design/technology. Students are far more engaged when involved in play based learning.

We are encouraging Bronte teachers to focus on play/empathy/experience/inquiry based teaching in the outdoor living classroom. The Bronte facility has 2 beds utilising a wicking bed design with a reservoir of water beneath the soil. All beds have interactive signage. Over 300 vegetable seedlings are raised and harvested in the garden annually on a rotating seasonal basis.



BRONTE PUBLIC SCHOOL

The organic vegetable garden is comprised of 7 raised veggie beds with attached round tables to run student classes as an outdoor classroom. The garden is located on the pavement outside of Bronte Public School which encourages community

Two of the beds utilise a wicking bed design with a reservoir of water under the soil layer. All beds have informative/interactive signage. Over 300 vegetable seedlings are raised and sown in the garden on a seasonally rotating basis. The garden is a partnership with the My Organic Schools initiative.

BRAINways SUMMER CAMP

After its success in previous years, The Summer Camp program is back in 2019.

The Summer Camp has two components: a two days immersion and a challenge.

On the first day of the two days immersion, the students will be introduced to four topics in the Maths/Science or Humanities areas. The 2019 Topics are:

Mathematics/Science:

The Science and Maths of Music
The Heat Is On: An Investigation of Thermodynamics
Mathematical Pictures: Graphing in Algebra
Shaping Genes

Humanities:

Forging Ahead with Medicine
Can Computers Think?: A Philosophical Exploration of AI
Identity in Focus: An Introduction to Psychology
A Universe Between Pages: World Building

Based on the research suggesting that gifted students benefit from the availability of choice and from an extended, uninterrupted engagement with a topic, the second day of the immersion program will give the students the opportunity to select one of the four topics introduced and explore it in depth.

The participation in the immersion days grants the students the chance to a submission in the Summer Camp challenge.

The challenge component of the Summer Camp program was developed based on the research showing that challenges and competitions are very powerful intrinsic motivators when they give the students the opportunity to sustain the engagement with the topic for a longer period. The challenge involves the completion of a research and the submission of a product for evaluation.

The Summer Camp program is developed and presented by BRAINways Education.


